Scripture (New International Version)

Philippians 1:1-11

¹ Paul and Timothy, servants of Christ Jesus,

To all God's holy people in Christ Jesus at Philippi, together with the overseers and deacons:

- ² Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- ³ I thank my God every time I remember you. ⁴ In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy ⁵ because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, ⁶ being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.

⁷ It is right for me to feel this way about all of you, since I have you in my heart and, whether I am in chains or defending and confirming the gospel, all of you share in God's grace with me. ⁸ God can testify how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus.

⁹ And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and
depth of insight, ¹⁰ so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, ¹¹ filled with the
fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ—to the glory and praise of God.

4.	When Paul prays for the Philippians, verses 4 and 5, what is his attitude and why?
5.	In verse 6, why does Paul feel confident?
6.	How are Paul's feelings for the Philippians independent of circumstances? (verse 7)
7.	Verse 8 reveals 3 aspects regarding Paul's feelings about the Philippians. List them here.
8.	In verse 9 what is Paul's prayer for the Philippians?

9.	Verses 10 and 11 reveal the desired outcomes from Paul's prayer for the Philippians. What are they?	
	Deeper Read Acts 16:11-40. From this passage, list people in Philippi who may have seen Paul's letter. What did each of these people do to make Paul remember them with thankfulness and joy?	
2.	In Philippians 1:1 why does Paul address the church in Philippi as "God's holy people"?	
3.	How can verse 6 be an encouragement to us as we enter a new year?	
4.	How can verse 7 bring comfort both now and in the future?
