
So, what's my core identity – Mary or Martha?

In his book *The Screwtape Letters*, C.S. Lewis warns against the power of seemingly minor or mundane amusements to lead us, subtly and imperceptibly, away from God: "It does not matter how small the sins are provided that their cumulative effect is to edge the man away from the Light and out into the Nothing."

As you prepare for worship today, ask God to quiet and focus your mind, and to make room within your heart for His will and intention for you.
