Sermon Title: "Love Beyond Limits"

Pastor: Pastor Mike Kenyon **Primary Text:** Romans 12:9-21

Additional Texts: Romans 12:1-2; Deut. 32:35; Prov. 25:21-22

Theme/Concept

Paul implores believers to sincerely love others, showing genuine affection and honor. Love advocates for a life of humility, blessing those who persecute, rejoicing with those who rejoice, and weeping with those who weep. Overcoming evil with good, encouraging peace and harmony within communities, and leaving justice to the Lord are characteristics of believers who practice love.

Scripture Passage: Romans 12:9 - 21 (NIV)

Love in Action

9 Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. **10** Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves. **11** Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord. **12** Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. **13** Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality.


14 Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse. **15** Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn. **16** Live in harmony with one another. Do not be proud, but be willing to associate with people of low position.[a] Do not be conceited.

17 Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everyone. 18 If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. 19 Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: "It is mine to avenge; I will repay,"[b] says the Lord. 20 On the contrary:

"If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink. In doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head."[c]

21 Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.
